Year 7

Students start their journey at Chace and take their first steps towards becoming the leaders of tomorrow. A focus on transition and close links with primary schools ensure our students quickly dive into their exciting daily learning. Students develop a deep understanding of our values Belonging, Responsibility and Excellence. Students acquire a rich vocabulary through a love of reading and this, along with our numeracy principles, underpins their learning across all subjects.



Year 8

Students continue to study a wide range of subjects to develop their knowledge and understanding. Our curriculum encourages the use of oracy to learn so students can elaborate and explain clearly their understanding and ideas. Students continue to develop culturally, emotionally, intellectually and socially.



Year 9

Year 9 is a Key Stage 3 to 4 transition year where pupils maintain their study of Year 7 and 8 subjects and prepare to embark onto Level 2 programmes of study in KS4. Our broad and balanced curriculum ensures that students are confident across their subjects including in the arts of speaking and listening, making formal presentations and participating in debate. Students continue to develop good independent study habits and learn a range of ways to revise effectively.

Year 10

The Year 10 curriculum builds on the skills, knowledge and understanding students have gained in Key Stage 3. Our Chace Guarantee puts the personal development of all students at the heart of what we do. For this reason, students will have the opportunity to participate in a wide range of extracurricular activities before school, during lunchtime and after school. Our curriculum beyond the classroom caters for a wide range of interests and gives students a chance to experience and learn new things, socialise with others and develop their sense of belonging.

Students will participate in enrichment days throughout the year based on the themes of Wellbeing, Culture, Citizenship, Careers and STEAM. Students have multiple opportunities on these days to experience workshops, employer encounters, visits to galleries, theatres, field studies, zoos, museums, and trips abroad to widen their experiences. Our students also attend conferences and university visits to raise ambition and aspiration.

Expressive arts are greatly valued at Chace, enabling students of all ages to work together performing, directing and creating. Our membership to Sports England reflects our commitment to enabling all students to participate in and achieve excellence in sports. We are proud of our very successful Sixth Form and our talented Sixth Form students. We set high standards of work, and have high expectations of them, both as learners and as role models. In return, our students receive excellent teaching, inspiring a love of learning and individual expert help and advice regarding progression routes to university, Further Education, apprenticeships and employment. We are particularly proud of our increasing numbers of successful Oxbridge and Russell Group applications and entrants. Typically, around 60% of students are placed at their first choice of university with a further 20% entering full time employment or nondegree apprenticeships in industries such as firefighting, IT, pilot training and marketing.

As with the rest of the school, holistic personal development is central to our ethos. All Year 12 students participate in our enrichment programme Chace +. Students participate in a range of activities to promote wellbeing, such as yoga, weight training, cooking for life, craft and music. We value student voice in the Sixth Form and have a strong student leadership team and Sixth Form Committee.
