<p><u>Link to prior learning:</u></p> <p>Students will build upon the techniques, process, materials and understanding developed in year 10. They will develop their use and application of subject specific terminology and the effects these have on visual imagery. These skills will continue to develop through further exploration and experimentation in year 11.</p>
<p><u>Rationale of sequencing:</u></p> <p>The knowledge and skills which have been embedded in year 10 are further enhanced through continued exploration of processes and materials.</p>
