# First Give 2018



First Give is an educational school programme which helps young people use their time and talents to improve their community. At Chace, students in Year 9 spend two months during Life Skills lessons identifying social issues in our community and then engaging with local charities. Students select a charity and produce engaging presentations that champion their chosen charity to compete in the School Final to win a £1000 grant for their charities.

### Year 7 'Break n bag' project update:



## Bronze Expedition

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award is a flexible programme that helps to develop young people for life and work by helping them to gain new skills, push themselves physically, help others, and explore new territories. There are three levels of programme which when successfully completed lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold award. The main difference between them are the minimum length of time they take to complete, how challenging they are and the minimum age you can start. The Bronze award is for young people aged 14+ and involves volunteering, physical activities, learning new skills, and an expedition.





# The Big Bang Near Me

# The Big Bang Fair— Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths



On Tuesday 10th July, children from 14 Enfield primary schools came to Chace to participate in the Big Bang Fair. The children have been working on science projects in their schools and presented their projects to real life scientists who came to support the event. The scientists looked at the projects, asked questions and listened to the science that the children have been learning and investigating. The projects covered everything from how to make dirty water clean, volcanoes, density of materials and how the shape of a boat can affect how quickly it sinks. This was followed by a question and answer session with the scientists where the children learnt about the different paths into science and the many different jobs that you can do. Highlights of the event included the children making bath bombs, investigating acids and alkalis, making slime and looking at their own cheek cells under the microscope in the Science labs.

We also had a visit from the Titan II Truck run by RS Components. The truck is worth over one million pounds and is 35 tons. Both the primary children and students from Chace were able to explore and experience the exhibits including two different virtual reality video games, learning about how 3D printers work and how they can be used to make prosthetic limbs and finding out how augmented reality is used to make apps such as Pokemon go! They also heard about different British inventors who are doing amazing things with STEM right now. The primary children were taken around Chace by a team of 30 Year 9 STEM Ambassadors who answered their questions about life at 'big' school, supported them with their experiments and helped them find their way around the school. Our primary visitors and their teachers were very impressed by our students and said that the day would not have been such a success day without them. The Big Bang Fair at Chace was a huge success and engaged everyone in a range of STEM activities.
