

KS4 Long term Curriculum plan: BTEC Tech awards L1/2 Health and Social Care-Component 1 and 2 -A+B Year 10

Curriculum Aim:

In BTEC Health and Social care we equip the students to use the knowledge and skills from GCSEs, to give them the opportunity to apply their academic knowledge to everyday and work contexts. This gives learners the opportunity to build skills that show an aptitude for further learning, both in the sector and more widely. The approach to the suite is based on well-established BTEC assessment approaches that are proven to be successful in building skills and motivating learners to engage fully with challenging study and have a better understanding of the Health and Social care sector.

Link to Prior learning: This subject complements the learning in GCSE programmes such as GCSE English, Biology and Psychology. Where students will have to use their analytical skills to apply what they have learnt in a vocational context.

Rationale of Sequencing: The BTEC Tech Award is an introduction to vocational learning. Learners will investigate how, in real situations, human development is affected by different factors and that people deal differently with life events, eg How do people grow and develop through their lives? How can factors such as lifestyle choices and relationships affect this? This starts as a firm foundation in building up their understanding of what Health and Social care entails, by gaining fundamental skills to prepare them for the exams later on throughout the study.
