
Teaching and Learning at Chace

Dear Parents, Carers and Students

This year we will be working more closely with you and our students to share research and the best strategies to improve learning. We are really proud that teaching at Chace is research and evidence informed and want to use this bulletin to share some of the work we are doing to improve teaching and learning. We encourage you to engage in the research too and discuss the different strategies with your child to support their learning.

Effective Study Skills & Revision Techniques

Psychological research has repeatedly demonstrated that our memory for the information we learn is not very reliable. The Ebbinghaus Forgetting Curve shows that we will forget over 60% of what we have learnt after just one day. With the new linear exams and students sitting exams up to three years after learning material, it is vitally important that they **space learning over time** rather than 'cramming.' This ensures success in exams AND deeper, life-long learning.



How to improve memory and beat the 'forgetting curve'

Encourage students to retrieve information regularly

To ensure we remember what we have learnt, we need to regularly practise retrieving information from our memories. This is because we make and store new memories by establishing neural pathways in our brains. If the neural pathway is strong, we can recall information quickly. The way to improve the strength of these neural pathways is to revisit the same information regularly – each time we retrieve information, the neural pathway is reinforced meaning we can access information quicker to be used in short term memory, for example, to solve problems or answer a question. It is a bit like our memory of driving routes. When we first drive to a new location, we may have to use a map or specific directions. But each time we take the same route, our knowledge of the route is improved until eventually we can get to our location without using a map.

Students can strengthen their memory of the material they are learning in several ways. For example, they could complete quizzes, use flashcards, talk about a topic from memory, complete keyword tests or use free recall. One way you can encourage your child to retrieve information is to ask them about their learning and see if they can explain key concepts without their notes. Anything they struggle with is an area for revision! You may also find that teachers are setting quizzes for homework—encourage your child to take these seriously and aim at getting 100% using the three attempts available. Students can also complete text book questions from memory, use online quizzes for extra retrieval practice or write essays or exam answers without their notes. If they follow this up by checking their answers against their notes or the text book information they will continually consolidate and improve their learning and build confidence at the same time.

Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you for your support this term regarding attendance. We now are proud to share that with our joint teamwork we have one of the highest attendance figures in Enfield with an average whole school attendance of 95.6%. Persistent absence (90% or lower), is 11%. Both are significantly better than this time last year and higher than both the national average and many local schools. This means we have more students in school learning and is thanks to our partnership with you and to the amazing work of the attendance team led by Mrs Barnham and Mrs Morder and support from the wider pastoral team who have been working with you and students this term. However, we continue to need your help and support in ensuring that we keep the standards high with uniform, conduct and of course attendance and punctuality.

Friday is the key day we still have a significant reduction in whole school attendance, so please send your child in unless they have a serious medical issue, or contact us if they do feel better and can attend school for part of the day.

Just a reminder, we have free breakfast for all students before 8.30am, warm croissants, sausage rolls, fruit and even pancakes with chocolate sauce. In the colder season we are also putting on free hot chocolate. So get in early and enjoy the food and refreshments on offer for free before 8.20 in the Diner.

Studies have shown that when children miss 17 days a year of their education they drop one GCSE grade on average per subject. An attendance figure of 90% means that a student would have missed the equivalent of 4 weeks of school and 100 lessons in an academic year. This is why we set the ideal attendance standard as a minimum of 97%, enabling students to be in school learning and reaching their true potential.

We monitor attendance carefully and regularly look at attendance and the progress being made by students. If there are concerns we will contact you and in the most serious cases we do conduct home visits and issue penalty notices in line with our *Attendance Policy*.

I would also like to feedback that the lateness to lessons and registration has greatly improved. We will continue to use our *Positive Behaviour Policy* to ensure students are getting to lessons on time and learning.

The diagram below is included now in our Chace Values, and clearly shows the impact of attendance and punctuality on lost learning.



Online Safety Update

TikTok app safety – What parents need to know

What is TikTok?

It's a social media app that gives users the opportunity to share 60 second short videos with friends, family or the entire world. Videos shared range from funny sketches to lip-sync videos featuring special effects. Currently, the app is available in 34 languages with 150 million active users. Like Musical.ly before it, it is most popular with under 16s.

What is the minimum age for TikTok app?

13 is the minimum age according to TikTok's terms and conditions.

What should parents be concerned about?

When you download the app **users can see all the content without creating an account** although they are not able to post, like or share anything until they've set up an account on the app. You can set up your account by using your existing Google, Facebook, Instagram account, via email or phone.

By default all accounts are public so anyone on the app can see what your child shares. However, only approved followers can send them messages. Users can like or react to a video, follow an account or send messages to each other. There is the risk that **strangers will be able to directly contact children** on the app.



Children may be **tempted to take risks to get more of a following** or likes on a video so it's important to talk about what they share and with who. To delete an account you have to request a code from the app using a phone number. **Internet Matters Team - 2019**



2020 Examinations Contingency Date

We have been informed by the JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications) who are the providers of regulations and examination practices across the UK that they are planning to hold an exam contingency day on **Wednesday 24th June 2020**. 
In the Diner we only use products from local butchers and local fruit and vegetable suppliers guaranteeing that our produce is fresh. Please see the next page for our menu and prices.


