This is a guide to our academic support policy and therefore what is listed is indicative rather than exhaustive.

1	Less progress than expected or than other students Incomplete work, assessments or home learning Poor A2L grades	Form tutor OR subject teacher to have a learning conversation, agree contract and set SMART targets with the student. All information shared with:  • Parents • Subject teacher/form teacher • Sixth form team including Study Support Officer
		Subject intervention/support eg 1-1s, attendance of intervention support
2	Discernibly behind. At risk of under-achievement in 1 or more subjects.  Lack of effort and poor A2L in more than one subject  A high level of incomplete work and incomplete home learning	Sixth form study support officer to have a learning conversation, agree contract and set SMART targets with the student. All information shared with:  • Parents • Subject teacher • Sixth form leadership team  2 periods of compulsory supervised study sessions per subject, with information shared with parents  Half termly attendance of study skills workshop  Continued subject intervention/support eg 1-1s, attendance of intervention support

3	Serious underachievement likely.  Prediction of U and E grades in subjects	Sixth form leadership team to have a learning conversation, agree contract and set SMART targets with student, Parents MUST be present at the meeting. All information shared with:  • Subject teacher • Head teacher  Alternative pathways considered.  At least 2 periods of compulsory supervised study per subject. All study periods are likely to be supervised.  Regular attendance of supervised study skills workshops.
4	Progression jeopardised  If not making progress at Stage 3, there will be a formal Stage 3 review	Meeting with the Head of Sixth Form, Deputy or Headteacher, parents and student to review Stage 3 interventions and discuss next steps, including alternative pathways.  Formal email/letter outlining consequences of failing to meet stage 3 targets.  Setting of clear, specific targets, reviewed after 3 weeks.  All study periods to be supervised with daily contact with parents.  At 3 week review: all targets to be scrutinised. Next steps, including alternative pathways, to be reviewed.
